## ORLGA CLUB CHAMPIONSHIP RULES

## October 29, 30, 31, 2018

<u>RULES:</u> USGA Rules of Golf will apply. The scores must be posted as Tournament scores.

LOCAL RULES: Current ORLGA Local Rules also apply. Any further course instructions and rules will be provided on the day of play.

DROP ZONES: Only the following drop zones will be in play:

Panther's Run – None Tigers Eye - #11 Lions Paw - #3 and #6

FORMAT: 54-Hole Individual Stroke Play Event

<u>FLIGHTS AND PAIRINGS:</u> The number of flights is determined by the number of players. Flight status and Day 1 Pairings will be determined by October 15th USGA Index.

Day 2 and 3 pairings will be established using gross score, regardless of flight. The overall club champion and runner-up can come from any flight.

<u>TEE BOXES</u>: All players will play from the same tee boxes – From the Red Tee Markers on Lions Paw and Panther's Run and the Gold Tee Markers on Tigers Eye.

<u>CLUB CHAMPIONSHIP WINNER:</u> The player returning the lowest 54-hole gross score will be the Club Champion. The player returning the second lowest 54-hole gross score will be the runner-up. The overall gross winner and runner-up will not be eligible to win any other prize. If there is a tie for Club Champion, players will then move on to Sudden Death until a winner is determined. All other ties will be broken using USGA recommended methods.

<u>FLIGHT WINNERS:</u> The player returning the lowest 54-hole NET score in each flight will be the Net winner of the flight. The player returning the lowest 54-hole Gross score in all flights except flight 1 will be the Gross Flight winners. If there is a tie for 1st place, the winner will be determined by the USGA recommended method.

<u>SCORING:</u> Each player must exchange her Official scorecard with another competitor in the foursome. They keep your Official Tournament Scores. Only the Official scorecard per player shall be returned to the Tournament Committee with two signatures. A scorecard is deemed returned when the score is posted on the scoreboard. You can verify

your official scores by recording them on your "Backup" scorecard. **Double check that scores on Official and Backup scorecards match, then the player and the scorer sign the official scorecard and return it to the scoring table.** 

<u>PACE OF PLAY:</u> For the enjoyment of all players and to be fair to all players, please maintain an acceptable pace of play. Keep up with the group in front of you. If your foursome falls behind, you are encouraged to speak up asking your fellow competitors to find ways to improve your foursome's pace of play.

<u>DOUBT AS TO PROCEDURE:</u> RULE 3-3 – If a competitor is doubtful of her rights or procedure, she may, without penalty, complete the hole with two balls. After the doubtful situation has arisen and before taking further action, the competitor must announce to her fellow-competitor that she intends to play two balls and which ball she wishes to count if the Rules permit. TAKE A PHOTO OF THE SITUATION IF POSSIBLE. The competitor must report the facts of the situation to the Designated Rules Official before returning her score card. If she fails to do so, she is disqualified. The Designated Rules Official is that pro-shop staff member who is available at the clubhouse of the course being played.
