

ORLGA CLUB CHAMPIONSHIP RULES 2021
AUGUST 23, 25, 27, 2021

RULES:

- USGA Rules of Golf and current local ORLGA rules will apply. Any further course instructions and rules will be provided on the day of play.
- The scores must be posted as Competition scores. Scores will be added to Ringers cards.
- August 19th USGA Index will be used for all three days of competition

DROP ZONES:

- The following drop zones will be in play:
 - Panther's Run - #18 (end of fairway on the right, will be marked)
 - Tiger's Eye - #11
 - Lion's Paw - #3 and #6

FORMAT:

- 54 Hole Individual Stroke Play Event. Each hole must be played out until ball is holed.

FLIGHTS:

- There will be a **Caspian Division** and a **Tigress Division**.
- The **Tigress Division** will have two flights – **Women's Senior Club Champion** and the **Red Flight**

PAIRINGS:

- Day 1 pairings will be based on August 19th USGA handicap index.
- Caspian Division - Pairings for Day 2 & 3 will be established using gross scores from preceding round.
- Tigress Division - Pairings for Day 2 & 3 will be established using gross scores within each flight from preceding round.

TEE BOXES:

- The Caspian Division players will play from the **red** tee box on Panther's and Lion's and from the **gold** tee box on Tiger's Eye.
- The Tigress Division players will play from the **red** tee box on **all** three courses (Lion's, Panther's & Tiger's Eye).

CLUB CHAMPIONSHIP WINNER:

❖ **Caspian Division:**

- The player returning the lowest 54-hole gross score will be the Club Champion. The player returning the second lowest 54-hole gross score will be the Runner-Up.
- The overall gross winner and runner-up will not be eligible to win any other prize.
- If there is a tie for Club Champion, players will then move on to *Sudden Death until a winner is determined.
- Once the Club Champion and Runner-Up have been determined, the player returning the lowest 54-hole NET score will be the NET winner of this flight.
- All other ties will be broken using USGA recommended methods.

SENIOR CLUB CHAMPIONSHIP WINNER:

❖ Tigress Division, Senior Flight:

- The player returning the lowest 54-hole gross score will be the Senior Club Champion. The player returning the second lowest 54-hole gross score will be the Runner-Up.
- The overall gross winner and runner-up will not be eligible to win any other prize.
- If there is a tie for Senior Club Champion, players will then move on to *Sudden Death until a winner is determined.
- Once the Senior Club Champion and Runner-Up have been determined, the player returning the lowest 54-hole NET score will be the NET winner of this flight. The player returning the second lowest 54-hole NET score will be the Runner-Up.
- All other ties will be broken using USGA recommended methods.

RED FLIGHT WINNER:

❖ Tigress Division, Red Flight

- The player returning the lowest 54-hole gross score will be the Red Flight Winner. The player returning the second lowest 54-hole gross score will be the Runner-Up.
- The overall gross winner and runner-up will not be eligible to win any other prize.
- If there is a tie for Red Flight Winner, players will then move on to *Sudden Death until a winner is determined.
- Once the Red Flight Winner and Runner-Up have been determined, the player returning the lowest 54-hole NET score will be the NET winner of this flight.
- All other ties will be broken using USGA recommended methods.

**Sudden death playoff will begin on Tiger's Eye hole #18 and will move on to hole #1, #2, etc. until one player wins the hole solely.*

SCORING:

- Each player must exchange her OFFICIAL Scorecard with another competitor in the foursome. They will keep your OFFICIAL TOURNAMENT SCORES.
- Only the OFFICIAL scorecard per player shall be returned to the Tournament Committee with two signatures.
- A scorecard is deemed returned when the score is posted on the scoreboard. You can verify your official scores by recording them on your "Backup" scorecard. **Double check that scores on the Official and Backup scorecards match, then the player and the scorer sign the official scorecard and return to the scoring table.**

PACE OF PLAY:

- For the enjoyment of all players and to be fair to all players, please maintain an acceptable pace of play. Acceptable pace of play is determined by the time and the gap between your group and the one in front of you. If you keep up with the group in front of you, there will **NEVER** be a pace of play issue.
- If your foursome falls behind, you are encouraged to speak up, asking your fellow competitors to find ways to improve your foursome's pace of play.
- Start times will be written on scorecards and there will be marshals out on the course monitoring pace of play. Forecaddies will be positioned around the course to help with ball location.

- If a marshal determines that your pace of play is unacceptable causing your group to be out of position, you will be notified. **First** infraction will result in a warning; **second** infraction will result in a 1-stroke penalty assessed to the slow player.

IF IN DOUBT...

We plan to have marshals available to monitor pace of play and to assist in rules clarification. If marshals are unavailable or unable to assist in the clarification of a rule, players have the option to play out the hole with 2 balls. If this is what you decide to do:

1. You **MUST** announce that you are playing 2 balls to another player and explain why. Your explanation should include which ball you feel follows the correct procedure. This must be done **BEFORE** making another stroke.
2. If possible, **TAKE A PHOTO OF THE SITUATION.**
3. After the round but before you sign or turn in your score card, you **MUST** report the facts of the situation to the Designated Rules Official and get a ruling. The Designated Rules Official is the pro-shop staff member who is available at the clubhouse of the course being played.
4. Once a ruling is obtained, the scorecard should be completed in accordance with the ruling and the scorecard signed and submitted.
5. If a player fails to do this, then they will be disqualified.
